

# **Gourdin-Gourdine Veteran Soldiers of World War I**

On April 6, 1917, the United States declared war against Germany and the Central Powers of Europe. When the nation called for able-bodied men to serve their country many of our ancestors answered the call. Below is a list of Gourdins and Gourdines, of African Descent, who answered the call.

## **Gourdin, David ( Pvt )**

b. 1896, Moncks Corner, Berkeley, SC; enlisted on 16 Jul 1918, at Mt. Holly; served in Company A, 1st Provisional Regiment, 155th Brigade; honorably discharged on 18 Sep 1918; 25% disabled.

## **Gourdine, Isaiah ( Pvt )**

b. 1890, Pineville, Berkeley, SC; enlisted on 6 Oct 1917, at Moncks Corner; served in Company A, 306th Service Battalion Quarter Master Corps; honorably discharged on 28 Jul 1919.

## **Gourdine, James ( Pvt )**

b. 1895, Mt. Holly, Berkeley, SC; enlisted on 16 Oct 1917, at Moncks Corner; served in 156th Dep Brigade, to 28 May 1918, then Dep Service Company, 12th Army Service Corps; honorably discharged on 12 Jul 1919.

## **Gourdine, Joe ( Pvt )**

b. 5 May 1897, St. Stephen, Berkeley, SC; enlisted on 25 Sep 1918, at Charleston; served in 156th Dep Brigade; honorably discharged on 10 Dec 1918.

## **Gourdin, Peter ( Pvt )**

b. 4 Jul 1887, Pineville, Berkeley, SC; enlisted on 25 Sep 1918, at Charleston; served in 156th Dep Brigade; honorably discharged on 6 Dec 1918.

## **Gourdin, Robert: (Pvt)**

b. 1893, Pineville, Berkeley, SC; enlisted on 16 Jul 1918, at Moncks Corner; svc; 156th Dep Brigade, to 8 Sep 1918, then Company A, 345th Service Battalion; honorably discharged on 23 July 1919.

## **Gourdine, Samuel ( Pvt )**

b. 8 Sep 1896, Wateree, Richland, SC; enlisted on 27 Jul 1918, at Richland County; served in Company A, 330th lab Battalion Quartermaster Corps; honorably discharged on 14 Mar 1919.
